

# Expository Essay What it is and How to Write it?

An Expository is a list of cited sources that you used or which are related to a specific topic. They are arranged in a way that includes a short description or a detailed summary. The Expository can be arranged in a sequence by date of announcement or arranged by the author, with citations attached to print on digital materials, such as books, newspaper articles, journal articles, dissertations, government documents, websites, etc. Your teacher might ask you to [essay writer](#) a very formal research paper that requires an Expository. The Expository helps you show your capability to recognize or assess the literature and thus approach the research problem from an informed position. It serves as a trick to evaluate what research you have done and how much is left. As a result, it plays an instrumental role in creating your point of view. Expository entails a summary of a topic. In fact, its most important function is to summarize the topic, a function which is sometimes the only thing that it does. Annotated bibliographies summarize the topic in ways that answer key questions. What is the purpose of this book or article?
